PURPOSE:

- To solicit applications for the Clinical Research Units (CRUs) for the NIAID Consortium for Food Allergy Research (CoFAR). The CoFAR CRUs are responsible for implementation of clinical trials and studies for the Consortium
- To propose multi-center cutting edge clinical trials in the areas of prevention and treatment of food allergy
- To work closely and in collaboration with the CoFAR Leadership Center to provide the scientific strategy and organizational structure of the CoFAR

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply for NIH support.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Application budgets are not limited but need to reflect the actual needs of the proposed project.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: limited to 7 years
