WHAT: NIH NIA Alzheimer's Clinical Trials Consortium (U24) (<http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/rfa-files/RFA-AG-17-005.html>)

REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS NUMBER: RFA-AG-17-005

PURPOSE:

- To establish an Alzheimer's disease Clinical Trials Consortium (ACTC) that will run trials focused on interventions that may prevent, delay, or treat the symptoms of Alzheimer's disease (AD) and other age related dementias. The ACTC will include multiple clinical trials sites and trial coordination and management infrastructure.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply for NIH support.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$10 million direct costs per year
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: limited to 5 years
