PURPOSE:

- To support creative educational activities with a primary focus on **Curriculum or Methods Development** in Big Data Science to augment current institutional curricula for the training of predoctoral level biomedical scientists and provide concentrated instruction in the tools, approaches and quantitative analysis concepts in data science.
- The over-arching goal of this BD2K R25 program is to support educational activities that complement and/or enhance the training of a workforce to meet the nation's biomedical, behavioral and clinical research needs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from diverse backgrounds, including underrepresented racial and ethnic groups, individuals with disabilities, and women are always encouraged to apply for NIH support.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$100,000 direct costs per year for curriculum development, and an additional \$50,000 per year for applications proposing to serve as the lead to coordinate the program.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: limited to 3 years
