RAP: Resource Allocation Program

RAP Spring 2015 Cycle is nearly complete: 204 applications were submitted using our new electronic application module. Of the 204 proposals that went through the full RAP review process, 67 were funded for a total of \$2,575,641! Notifications are still in progress. Applications sent in response to mechanisms that use independent review (46 in total this cycle) are still in progress.

SSP: Special Strategic Projects

Tri-Institutional Partnership (TriP):

The RDO supports strategic projects for the VCR and EVCP. One such on-going collaborative is the Tri-Institutional Partnership (TrIP) - a collaborative research partnership established in 2014 between Berkeley, LBNL and UCSF. In step with the White House BRAIN Initiative, our inaugural TrIP program – BayBRAIN – is focused on neurotechnology and neuroscience. We are currently assessing progress of the 6 BRAINseed pilot awards (totaling \$1.5M) funded last year through this program. In addition, we have a BayBRAIN Industry Day slated for the fall – more information will come soon.

We are continuing this valuable collaborative partnership and plan to expand the reach in 2016 into new avenues such as microbiome research.

DARPA/BTO – UCSF Funding Opportunity Pipeline:

Keith Yamamoto, UCSF's Vice Chancellor for Research has negotiated with the leadership of the Defense Advanced Research Projects (DARPA) Biological Technologies Office (BTO) to establish a direct pipeline for exceptional, innovative UCSF ideas to reach funding decision-makers at the BTO. The program Advisory Team, UCSF colleagues who have a deeper understanding of what DARPA is looking to fund, has just finished providing live feedback to the teams that submitted to this inaugural call. This feedback related to the projects' relative impact, innovation, and fit to DARPA BTO's interests. The next step is that some of these fantastic ideas will be submitted to the BTO leadership in the next month.
