REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS NUMBER: RFA-OH-22-001

PURPOSE:

- To solicit applications for funding Education and Resource Centers (ERCs) focused on occupational health, safety and research training, education and outreach.
- The overall objective of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) is to provide an adequate supply of qualified personnel to carry out the purposes of the Occupational Safety and Health Act. The ERCs are one of the principal means for meeting this objective
- ERCs must provide high-quality graduate training in a minimum of three academic programs. At least two of the Academic Training Programs must be in the disciplines of Industrial Hygiene (IH), Occupational Health Nursing (OHN), Occupational Medicine (OM), or Occupational Safety (OS)

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with their organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$1.8M, each year in total costs for an ERC
- Project Period: 3 years
- UCSF is not eligible for renewal and therefore not eligible to apply for a longer project period
