WHAT: Cookies for Kids' Cancer Clinical and Translational Research Awards (funding examples: <https://cookiesforkidscancer.org/pages/grants-funded>)

PURPOSE:

- To support peer-reviewed, cutting-edge clinical and translational research efforts at leading children's cancer centers.
- High quality, novel innovative research of high scientific merit that will be readily translatable to the clinic within a short period of time after funding (12-24 months) is encouraged and highly favored in the review process.

ELIGIBILITY:

- PI should be a senior investigator (Assistant Professor >5 years, Associate Professor or Professor) who is nationally recognized in clinical or translational research.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$100,000 per year for up to three years for a maximum total award of up to \$300,000.
 - Year 3 funding will be based on progress during years 1 and 2.
 - No indirect costs allowed.
 - NIH salary cap should be applied.
- Project Period: up to 2 years (3 years based on progress)

- **PIs submit directly to the LSP; RMS does not get involved unless and until you are nominated.**
