**WHAT:** HRSA Leveraging Health Service Equity Approaches for Sustainable HIV Epidemic Control (<https://www.grants.gov/web/grants/view-opportunity.html?oppld=339951>)

#### **PURPOSE:**

- To develop and expand unique platforms to bring best practices from domestic experiences to assist the global HIV/AIDS program in reaching epidemic control in Malawi, Zambia and other PEPFAR countries as identified, including scaling current activities for impact in HIV/AIDS treatment services in these countries.
- To develop and implement strategies to address social determinants and health inequalities found within the healthcare system to improve the delivery of quality HIV/AIDS services in Malawi, Zambia, and potentially in other identified PEPFAR-supported countries.
- To promote empowerment and linkage to health services among all adolescent girls and young women residing in targeted areas.
- To increase the capacity of health facilities to improve linkage to and continuity of HIV care.
- To partner with high-volume treatment sites to provide differentiated service delivery (DSD) models that address treatment interruption and improve viral suppression rates.
- To use quality improvement and family-centered strategies to support the care needs of mothers and their HIV-exposed infants throughout pregnancy and the post-partum breastfeeding period up to 24 months.
- To ensure optimized client care records and reporting and related data use to improve the HIV continuum of care at all stages.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- It is recommended that applicants form a consortium of members with a demonstrated history of collaboration to support activities for HIV prevention, care and treatment in underserved areas both in the U.S. and globally.
- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply.

#### **BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:**

- Award Budget: up to \$10,000,000 total costs per year
  - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: 5 years
