WHAT: National Comprehensive Cancer Network Young Investigator Award

PURPOSE:

- To invite proposals from young investigators with innovative ideas and an interest in improving the quality, effectiveness, and efficiency of care provided to cancer patients.
- To identify and fund top investigators in the early stages of their careers interested in participating and contributing to cancer research.
- The NCCN Foundation considers clinical, health services, and translational research projects equally meritorious for funding.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Be in a first full-time appointment as an Assistant Professor, Instructor, or an equivalent level.
- Have an MD, PhD, DO, or advanced nursing degree.
- Have a mentor in the proposed research field.
- This award is open to physicians, scientists, nurses, and others working in an oncology laboratory, clinical research or clinical setting, or cancer control program.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: up to \$150,000 total costs
 - Indirect expenses will be covered to a maximum of 8%.
- Project Period: 2 years
