WHAT: NSF National Artificial Intelligence (AI) Research Institutes (https://www.nsf.gov/pubs/2023/nsf23610/nsf23610.htm)

REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS NUMBER: NSF-23-610

PURPOSE:

- To make long-term investments in AI research in areas with the potential for long-term payoffs in the fields of personalized healthcare, enhanced national security, improved transportation, more effective education, and other economic and quality-of-life improvements.
- Building upon the nationwide network of AI Research Institutes, this National AI Research
 Institutes program solicitation will fund Institutes comprised of scientists, engineers, and
 educators united by a common focus on advancing the research frontiers in AI. The program
 seeks to build a broader nationwide network to pursue transformational advances in a range of
 economic sectors, and science and engineering fields. This NSF announcement allows for two
 groups. Group 2's Theme 3: Strengthening AI supports UCSF and UCSF Health efforts.
- Theme 3 Goals promotes the development of next generation AI systems that have been *strengthened* to provide greater usefulness, consistency, and robustness by exhibiting both the high performance of narrow AI and the general adaptability of strong AI. Proposals must address the all three of the goals -Grounding, Instructibility, and Alignment
- Use-Inspired Research Focus include but are not limited to:
 - Health and wellbeing, including various non-clinical aspects of physical and/or mental health.
 - o Improving human flourishing, for example, reducing hunger or coordinating humanitarian assistance.
 - Al advances that enable new discoveries in science, mathematics, or engineering.

ELIGIBILITY:

• Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: average up to \$4,000,000 total costs per year.
 - o Total budget across entire project period must be between \$16 million and \$20 million.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities. See NSF guide for limitations.
- Project Period: 4 to 5 years

- Sponsor (Full Proposal Deadline): May 17, 2024
