WHAT: NIH ORIP Modern Equipment for Shared-use Biomedical Research Facilities: Advancing Research-Related Operations (R24) (<https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PAR-21-326.html>)

REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS NUMBER: PAR-21-326

PURPOSE:

- To strengthen research-auxiliary activities of biomedical research facilities and to enhance the efficacy of their operation by providing support to purchase and install advanced equipment to enhance and modernize research-supporting operations.
- Targeted are core facilities, animal research facilities, and other research spaces that are used on a shared basis.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director/Principal Investigator (PD/PI) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply.
- The PD/PI does not need to have an NIH research grant or any other research support. The PD/PI may be a core or an animal research facility director, tenured, or non-tenured faculty member of the applicant organization. Typically, the PD/PI will be a scientist with a leadership role in overseeing or managing the shared-use facility and relevant scientific or technical expertise (documented in the biographical sketch) related to the requested technology.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget:
 - Award budget must be between \$25,000 and \$400,000 direct costs.
 - For requests of multiple pieces of the same or different equipment, the minimum budget for any given piece is \$10,000.
 - To ensure proper installation and functioning of the equipment, minor alteration and renovation (A&R) efforts can be included as a small component of the budget.
 - A&R support for minor projects may be included, if applicable, but shall not exceed 15% of the equipment costs (after educational discount is applied) or \$40,000 whichever is smaller.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: up to 1 year
