WHAT: Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation (<https://pcrf-kids.org/grants/>)

- Translational Research Grant
- Emerging Investigator Fellowship Grant

PURPOSE:

- Translational Research Grant:
 - To fund new research protocols and therapies that hold promise for improved outcomes and accelerates cures from the laboratory bench to the bedside of children and teens with high- risk cancers.
 - This Grant is given to single or multi-institutional programs that involve open cancer clinical trials or consortia, and implement new approaches to therapy.
- Emerging Investigator Fellowship Grant:
 - To support Post-Doctoral Fellowships and Clinical Investigator training for emerging pediatric cancer researchers to pursue exciting research ideas. These grants are intended to encourage and cultivate the best and brightest researchers of the future.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Translational Research Grant:
 - Applicants must have a PhD and/or MD.
- Emerging Investigator Fellowship Grant:
 - Applicants must have completed two years of their fellowship or not more than two years as a junior faculty instructor or assistant professor at the start of the award period.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Translational Research Grant:
 - Award Budget: up to \$75,000 direct costs per year
 - Project Period: up to 2 years
- Emerging Investigator Fellowship:
 - Award Budget: up to \$50,000 direct costs
 - Project Period: 1 year

NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS UCSF MAY SUBMIT: 1 for Translational Research Grant & 1 for Emerging Investigator Fellowship
