

UCSF May Submit 1 Application

Internal Deadline: 11:59 PM, Thursday, June 9th, 2022

Note: UCSF is eligible to apply to this opportunity, but will likely not be competitive. Preference will be given to institutions with high needs, low philanthropic support, and no current St. Baldrick's Foundation funding.

WHAT: St. Baldrick's Foundation Infrastructure Grant (<https://www.stbaldricks.org/file/sbf-infrastructure-grant-guidelines.pdf>)

PURPOSE:

- These grants are not for a specific research project, but rather for resources to allow more research to be done. They support institutions with the potential for more participation in childhood cancer clinical trials, but which currently lack necessary resources. Applications to support Clinical Research Associate (CRA) type positions are preferred.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director(s)/Principal Investigator(s) (PD(s)/PI(s)) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Grants average \$50,000 total costs.
 - Exceptions may be made for proposals with budgets documenting a need for more.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: 1 year.

- **Internal: 11:59 PM, Thursday, June 9th, 2022.** If multiple groups submit an LOI, an additional pre-application will be due Sunday, June 26th, 2022.

- Sponsor LOI: Friday, July 8th, 2022
- Sponsor Application: Friday, August 26th, 2022

To qualify for UCSF Limited Submission Program opportunities, applicants must have a paid UCSF appointment either at the time of application or anticipated by the time of award.
