WHAT: William T. Grant Scholars Program (http://wtgrantfoundation.org/grants/william-t-grant-scholars-program)

PURPOSE:

- To support career development for promising early-career researchers.
- To fund five-year research and mentoring plans that significantly expand junior researchers' expertise in new disciplines, methods, and content area.
- Applicants must select one of the following focus areas:
 - Reducing Inequality
 - To build, test, and increase understanding of approaches to reducing inequality in youth outcomes, especially on the basis of race, ethnicity, economic standing, language minority status, or immigrant origins. The Foundation is interested in research on programs, policies, and practices to reduce inequality in academic, social, behavioral, and economic outcomes. The Foundation does not fund research on the causes and consequences of inequality.
 - o Improving the Use of Research Evidence
 - To research strategies to improve the use of research evidence in ways that benefit young people ages 5-25 in the United States. The Foundation welcomes descriptive studies that reveal the strategies, mechanisms, or conditions for improving research use, as well as evaluations of deliberate efforts to increase routine and beneficial uses of research in decision-making.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicants must be in a tenure-track or other position in which there is a pathway to advancement in a research career at the applicant organization.
- Award may not be used as a post-doctoral fellowship.
- Applicants must have received terminal degree within 7 years of submitting application to sponsor.
 - o For PhDs: 7 years calculated from date doctoral degree conferred.
 - o For MDs: 7 years calculated from date of completion of first residency.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$350,000 total costs
 - The William T. Grant Foundation allows up to 7.5% indirect costs.
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: 5 years
