

UCSF May Submit 1 Application per School

WHAT: William T. Grant Scholars Program (<https://wtgrantfoundation.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/01/2025-Application-Guide-WTG-Scholars.pdf>)

PURPOSE:

- To support career development for promising early-career researchers by funding five-year research and mentoring plans that significantly expand researchers' expertise in new disciplines, methods, and content areas.
- Applicants must select one of the following focus areas:
 - **Reducing Inequality**
 - Build, test, or increase understanding of programs, policies, or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral, or economic outcomes of young people ages 5-25 in the United States, along dimensions of race, ethnicity, economic standing, language minority status, or immigrant origins.
 - The Foundation does **not** fund research on the causes and consequences of inequality.
 - **Improving the Use of Research Evidence**
 - To research strategies to improve the use of research evidence in ways that benefit young people ages 5-25 in the United States. The Foundation welcomes descriptive studies that reveal the strategies, mechanisms, or conditions for improving research use, as well as evaluations of deliberate efforts to increase routine and beneficial uses of research in decision-making.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicants must be in a tenure-track or other position in which there is a pathway to advancement in a research career at the applicant organization.
- Applicants must have received their doctorate within seven years of submitting their application. We calculate this by adding seven to the year the doctorate was conferred. In medicine, the seven-year maximum is dated from the completion of the first residency. The month in which the degree was conferred or residency completed does not matter for this calculation
- We strive to support a diverse group of researchers in terms of race, ethnicity, gender, and seniority, and we encourage research projects led by Black or African American, Indigenous, Latinx, and/or Asian or Pacific Islander American researchers.

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: \$425,000 total costs
 - The William T. Grant Foundation allows up to 7.5% indirect costs.
- Project Period: 5 years

NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS UCSF MAY SUBMIT: 4 (1 per School)

DUE DATES:

- **Internal:** NOON, Monday, April 28, 2025.
- PIs submit directly to the LSP; RMS does not get involved unless and until you are nominated.
- Mentor and Reference Letters: Wednesday, June 11, 2025.
- Sponsor Application: Tuesday, July 01, 2025.

To qualify for UCSF Limited Submissions Program opportunities, applicants must have a paid UCSF appointment either at the time of application or anticipated by the time of award.

The LSP is a selection process, not an award process. As the LSP is under significant time constraints, all reviewer feedback is optional. We encourage you to seek other avenues for proposal feedback.
