# **WHAT:** The Warren Alpert Distinguished Scholars Fellowship Award (https://www.warrenalpertfoundation.org/awards/)

#### PURPOSE:

- To support individual postdoctoral scientists of exceptional creativity in the field of neurosciences.
- To enable a postdoctoral researcher to advance to become a full-time faculty member at the Assistant Professor level or higher and to promote the development of a laboratory program that will lead to independent funding.

## ELIGIBILITY:

- Have an MD or PhD degree.
- Must hold a post-doctoral research position at a United States medical school, research institute, or academic institution.
- Minimum of 3 years and no more than 6 years of a post-doctoral fellowship by July 1, 2025
- Research focused in the field of Neuroscience
- Scholars will be chosen on the basis of the success in their prior post-doctoral work and other research as well as in the importance and creativity of their proposed future research.

# **BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:**

- Award Budget: up to \$200,000 per year
  - Award can be used to cover salary, lab costs & related expenses.
    - Up to 15% of indirect costs is included in the award.
- Project Period: 2 years
