PURPOSE:

- To train doctoral health psychology students, interns, and post-doctoral residents to provide integrated, interdisciplinary, behavioral health and Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and other Substance Use Disorder (SUD) prevention and treatment services in high need and high demand areas
- The program also supports faculty development of health service psychology
- The GPE program fosters an integrated and interprofessional approach to addressing access to care with specialized training in the provision of OUD prevention and treatment services
- Through these efforts, the GPE Program transforms clinical training environments and is aligned with HRSA's mission to improve health and achieve health equity through access to quality services, a skilled workforce, and innovative programs

ELIGIBILITY:

- Eligible entities are APA-accredited doctoral schools and programs of health service psychology, APA-accredited doctoral internships in professional psychology, and APA accredited post-doctoral residency programs in practice psychology

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: up to \$450,000 total costs per year
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: up to 3 years

PURPOSE:

- To enhance community-based experiential training focused on Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and other Substance Use Disorders (SUD) for students preparing to become behavioral health professionals.

- The OWEP Professionals program will train behavioral health professionals in the provision of OUD and other SUD prevention, treatment, and recovery services in high need and high demand areas. Special focus is on demonstrating knowledge and understanding of the specific concerns of children, adolescents, and transitional-age youth in high need and high demand areas who are at risk for behavioral health disorders.
- The OWEP Professionals program is designed to foster an integrated and/or interprofessional approach to training through academic and community partnerships for increasing the number of professionals trained to transform integrated behavioral health and primary care teams as well as to effectively prevent and treat OUD and other SUD in community-based practices.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Accredited institutions of higher education or accredited behavioral health professional training programs. These programs can include psychiatry, psychology, school psychology, behavioral pediatrics, psychiatric nursing, social work, school social work, SUD prevention and treatment, marriage and family therapy, occupational therapy, school counseling, or professional counseling

- Award Budget: up to \$450,000 total costs per year
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: up to 3 years

- To enhance community-based experiential training focused on Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and other Substance Use Disorders (SUD) for students preparing to become peer support specialists and other types of behavioral health-related paraprofessionals
- The Opioid Workforce Expansion Program Paraprofessionals program will train behavioral health-related paraprofessionals in the provision of OUD and other SUD prevention, treatment, and recovery services in high need and high demand areas. Special focus is on demonstrating knowledge and understanding of the specific concerns of children, adolescents, and transitional-age youth in high need and high demand areas who are at risk for behavioral health disorders
- The OWEP Paraprofessionals program is designed to expand and improve direct access to quality treatment and foster an integrated and/or interprofessional approach to address OUD and other SUD treatment emphasizing the role of the family and lived experience of the consumer through academic, community and non-traditional community organization partnerships

ELIGIBILITY:

- Academic institutions that have training programs for occupations such as peer support specialist, peer support counselor, community health worker, outreach worker, social services aide, substance abuse/addictions worker, youth worker, and promotor/a (for full list of occupations see the definitions section).

BUDGET AND PROJECT PERIOD:

- Award Budget: up to \$300,000 total costs per year
 - UCSF indirect cost policy will apply except for non-federal entities.
- Project Period: up to 3 years
