3TS: T32 Trainee Tracking Program

T32 NIH Updates from the T32 Trainee Tracking (3TS) Program

- October 2019 marked the beginning of the NIH requirement for utilizing the <u>xTRACT tool</u> for T32 Research
 Performance Progress Report (RPPR) submissions. Due to the lengthy process of historical data the process is
 proving to be lengthy. The 3TS program continues to offer support to assist programs with transferring their RPPR
 data into the NIH xTRACT module, but encourages all programs interested in training and assistance to contact
 <u>Halima Mohammed Todd</u> three months before the RPPR is due for submission. For additional information on
 RPPR due dates please log into eRA Commons or your Research Management Services (RMS) contact.
- New feature to NIGMS T32 Funding Opportunity Announcement is that all submissions are considered new (Type 1) applications, and there will be no renewal (Type 2) applications received under the new FOA. Since site visits have been part of the review process only for renewal applications, no site visits for peer review will be conducted under the new FOA. Site visits will take place as planned for renewal applications submitted under the parent T32 FOA. Contact your RMS contact for additional questions.
- Due Dates for Competing T32 Renewal Applications:
 - o May 25, 2020
 - o September 25, 2020

Applicants should check with the relevant Institute or Center (IC), since some do not accept T series applications for all three receipt/review/award cycles.

SSP: Special Strategic Projects

Tri-Institutional Partnership in Microbiome Research (TrI-P Microbiome)

UC San Francisco (UCSF), UC Davis (UC Davis) and Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory (LBNL), have formed a **Tri-Institutional Partnership in Microbiome Research** to catalyze and fund bold, synergistic, and potentially transformative collaborative research, addressing the major gaps in microbiome knowledge and technology identified by the OSTI Microbiome Interagency Working Group's FY2018-2022 Strategic Plan for Microbiome Research. The partners convened a well-attended, energetic **all-day workshop on Feb. 5, 2020 at the new Integrative Genomics Building at LBNL** to foster cross-institutional interaction. We were excited to have UCSF's Chancellor Sam Hawgood and LBNL's Director Mike Witherell join us.

TrI-P Microbiome Seed Grant Initiative

The Partnership has now followed up the networking event with a substantive seed grant opportunity supported by all three institutions to the tune of a *collective cool \$1,000,000*. The LOIs for these grants are due Feb. 28, 2020, with a submission deadline of April 3, 2020. Project awards are limited to \$200,000 per project, not to exceed \$80,000 per institution per proposal, and will be made available for an 18-month project period. By bringing together data scientists and biological researchers to generate novel hypotheses and co-design experiments, the TrI-P Microbiome initiative will generate impactful and novel research with concomitant structured data that will enable additional discoveries and insights through advanced computational approaches and high-performance computing resources, being mindful to position the institutions favorably for follow-on extramural funding. A unique aspect of the TrI-P Microbiome Initiative is its data-driven focus and data structural framework brought through the participation of LBNL's DOE-funded National Microbiome Data Collaborative (NMDC). The NMDC was founded to support the long-term advancement of microbiome science by building an open and integrated data system.

RAP: Resource Allocation Program

RAP launched the **SPRING 2020** cycle on January 29 and is now accepting applications from the UCSF research community. All electronic applications are due by Monday, **March 2**nd, **2020** at 2:00 pm (PT).

- <u>Eligibility & Compare Grants</u> assists applicants in identifying the most opportune grant based on applicant's eligibility.
- Eligibility requirements need to be met as of date of submission, no waivers allowed.
- <u>Submission Rules</u> list all rules that govern the submission process.
- Resources offers Statistics, Past Awardees, Success Stories, and more.

Faculty in need of financial support at a critical time in their career are encouraged to apply to RAP. The Program continues to offer the <u>Independence Support Award</u>, a grant mechanism designed to assist faculty who submitted an R01 grant that was not funded and may offer a way to maintain a baseline level of research activity during a funding gap. Similarly, the <u>Hardship Awards</u> is a mechanism designed to assist faculty investigators who are experiencing a temporary interruption in extramural funding and can document hardship. Finally, for those who have pursued non-classical pathways and wishing to resume their research careers, the <u>Re-entry</u> grant may be an option to consider.

Achieving success in obtaining funding support requires that applicants plan well in advance of the submission deadline. RAP's dynamic platform continues to leverage campus initiatives and combines supporting the needs of the funders with those of the applicants. RAP is fully committed to supporting faculty innovation and "Seeding Outstanding Research".
