- a successful BayBRAIN Neurotechnology Industry Day, a partnership with UC Berkeley and Berkeley Labs that brought together over 120 neurotechnology researchers and industry partners; as well as
 - an exciting speed-networking event with cross-cutting Environmental Health Initiative faculty; and another in partnership with the Geriatrics Department - the first of a series of networking events around the theme of aging. We look forward to funding a few seed grants following from these speed-networking events and supporting the follow-on networking events, too.

RAP: Resources Allocation Program

The 10 RAP Review Committees have completed the review of the 170 proposals submitted to the Fall 2015 Cycle. While the best score is still the main criteria taken into consideration when funding decisions are made, it is not the only factor. Funding agencies consider other elements when deciding who to fund: the potential to receive extramural funding, how well-funded the applicant is, the relevance of each proposal topic to the funder.

The RAP Committee, comprehensive of all the Directors of the RAP participating agencies, will meet in December to make final funding decisions.

At the end of each competition, every applicant receives written reviews without final scores. The reviews are good feedback if a resubmission is needed or can help with other projects. The results of the RAP Fall 2015 cycle will be available before the winter break.

The next deadlines for the RAP Spring 2016 Cycle are:

January 25 – Request for Applications

February 22 – Applications Deadline

LSP: Limited Submission Program

Recently:

- The LSP Annual Advisory Committee Meeting was held on October 29, 2015. The committee agreed to make a few key updates to be implemented over the coming year. These updates include: providing categorical feedback on internal applications, and updating reviewer COI criteria, among other improvements.
- The LSP presented to the Academic Senate Committee on Research on November 16, 2015—providing an overview of the program and information on expected updates and changes.

- Since October 1st:
 - 19 LSOs were announced by the LSP
 - 11 nominees were identified by the LSP to move off campus (including Keck, Brain Research Foundation, and Rita Allen)
 - 6 LSOs did not receive applications, and 3 are still in process

It's been a busy fall for the LGDP, supporting a UM1 proposal focused on HIV cure research and finishing up a U54 to establish a collaborative center for health disparities research focused on chronic disease prevention, among other efforts.

Will you soon be developing a large, complex proposal like a: NIH P01, P50, U01, U19, U54; NSF Science and Technology Centers: Integrative Partnerships; or the Integrated NSF Support Promoting Interdisciplinary Research and Education (INSPIRE) grants? If so, the RDO can help!

The PhD-trained manager of our Large, Multi-Investigator Grant Development Program (LGDP), Dr. Kristin Dolan, can be with you every step of the way. Specifically, the LGDP can offer:

- Strategy input and participation in science discussions
- Project management of the proposal preparation process, including timeline development and tracking, and liaising with the funding agency or Research Management Services
- Technical writing and editing
